Reeves County Hospital District Celebrates Local Healthcare Providers

Local hospital recognizes National Doctors' Day on March 30.

PECOS, Texas (March 21, 2022) – Whether you see them for treatment when you are ill or advice on staying healthy, our physicians offer an essential service. To celebrate the fantastic work of our local medical staff, Reeves County Hospital District (RCHD) is honoring our healthcare providers on March 30 as part of a nation-wide observance of National Doctors' Day.

“Our local healthcare providers have done so much amazing work, especially over the past two years,” says Brenda McKinney, CEO of RCHD. “Whether our patients were dealing with COVID-19 or a myriad of other conditions, the medical professionals in Reeves County never skipped a beat in treating and caring for our community.”

National Doctors' Day was first observed on March 30, 1933. Inspired by the anniversary of the first use of anesthesia by Dr. Crawford W. Long in 1842, Eudora Brown Almond, wife of Dr. Charles B. Almond, proposed the celebration to show appreciation for doctors everywhere.

The U.S. House of Representatives passed a resolution in 1958 to commemorate the occasion. With congressional approval in 1990, President George H.W. Bush signed a resolution officially designating March 30 as National Doctors' Day.

In Reeves County, the local medical community supports RCHD to care for patients. The local hospital district will be moving in the coming months into a brand-new healthcare campus designed to bring local healthcare into a new generation.

According to McKinney, the new 140,000-square-foot facility is designed for patient-centered healthcare: thoughtfully designed floor plans to comfortable patient rooms, spacious lobbies, and waiting pavilions to a relaxing dining area.

“While a physical building does not define healthcare, I know that our local physicians will be able to provide a new level of care in our new hospital and clinics,” McKinney explains. “Our providers are the cornerstone of healthcare services, and we are we are fortunate to have a compassionate medical team available here in Pecos.”
