Chevron donates PPE across Lea County

Chevron donated personal protective equipment (PPE) worth approximately \$19,000.

PECOS, Texas (August 5, 2020) – Chevron donated personal protective equipment (PPE) worth approximately \$19,000 for healthcare workers and others on the front line to help Permian Basin communities experiencing the COVID-19 pandemic.

The donations were distributed to hospitals, school districts and clinics in Eddy and Lea counties in New Mexico, and Culberson, Pecos, Reeves and Ward counties in Texas. The donation includes procedural masks and medical gloves purchased through MAP International, an organization that provides medical supplies and medications to nonprofit organizations around the world.

Brenda McKinney, CEO of Reeves County Hospital District, said, "On behalf of the staff and Board of Directors of Reeves County Hospital District, we truly cannot express our gratitude for such a valuable donation. We deal with COVID related patients pretty much 24/7, and many times during the last 4-5 months, there were several occasions we ran desperately low. Receiving such a gracious gift of masks and gloves is just priceless."
